

ICD 9 Codes

An individual's condition requiring feeding by tube can be either anatomic or due to a motility disorder. The following medical conditions may meet coverage criteria if they cause impairment for consuming, digesting and/or absorbing food. When a diagnosis does not suggest functional impairment additional diagnoses or additional clinical information may be required. Note that the following is a partial list of codes that may qualify for coverage.

140 – 149	Cancers – Lip, Oral Cavity, and Pharynx
150.0 – 150.9	Cancers – Esophagus
151.0 – 151.9	Cancers – Stomach
152.0 – 152.9	Cancers – Small Intestine including duodenum
250	Diabetes – mellitus
271.3	Lactose Sensitivity
278.0 – 278.03	Overweight and obesity
331.0 – 331.9	Other cerebral degenerations (e.g. Alzheimer's disease, mild cognitive impairment)
332.0 – 332.1	Parkinson's disease
335.0	Werdnig-Hoffmann disease
335.20	Amyotrophic lateral sclerosis (ALS)
343.0 – 343.9	Cerebral Palsy
434.01 – 434.91	Cerebrovascular accident
536.9	Unspecified functional disorder of stomach
564.0 – 564.9	Functional digestive disorders not elsewhere classified (e.g. constipation, diarrhea, irritable bowel)
783.0 – 783.9	Symptoms concerning nutrition metabolism and development (e.g. developmental disabilities, feeding difficulties and mismanagement, adult failure to thrive, underweight)
